

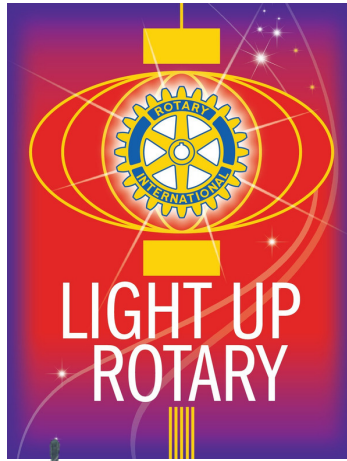

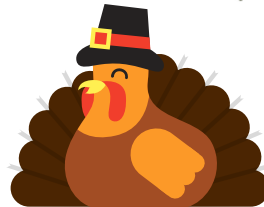

Review of Meeting: November 14, 2017

Rotarians and guests gathered in the former Pisces Restaurant, high atop the Hyatt Regency for food and fellowship. With President Delores Edwards presiding, DanTaylor lead the singing of the National Anthem and pledge to the flag. Jake Slagle provided the invocation. Delores introduced several visitors and the Songbirds provided greetings. Sergeant at Arms, Ryan Vincent collected some “happy dollars” and a few fines.

Program Chair, Karen Blake introduced our speaker, Dr. Paul Andrew Antony from the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. Receiving a B.S. in Biochemistry in 1994 from the University of Michigan, he then received an M.D. with Distinction in Research from the University of Michigan Medical School in the year 2000. He received a post graduate education from 2000 to 2006 at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Md. Leaving Michigan in 2006, he came to Baltimore first as a Research Associate in the Department of Oncology at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. Dr. Antony has remained in Baltimore up to the present time and among other things has been a guest researcher at the National Institute of Allergy & Infectious Diseases, Assistant Professor in the Department of Pathology and the Department of Microbiology at the University of Maryland School of Medicine and has been a lecturer of advanced and basic immunology at the Johns Hopkins University.

This reporter as been given eleven pages of Dr. Antony’s resume that includes his list of professional memberships, honors and awards, administrative service, institutional service, teaching service, PhD Committees, publications (peered-reviewed journal articles), medical student teaching/mentoring, grants, major speeches and proffered communications. Needless to say, there is not room to list these accomplishments.

With the use of visuals and graphics, Dr. Antony focused on his specialty, cancer immunotherapy. Knowing that cancer in some form affects almost every family, he went on to tell us about current cancer research and specifically about the research lab at Hopkins. He touched on the immune system, vaccines, T-cells, tumors, radiation and much more. What an incredible individual with a list of unbelievable accomplishments. We were most fortunate to have him as a guest speaker.
